The Texas 4-H Photography contest guidelines have been released and there are changes to the categories and the resolution rules. The state contest is for senior members who win the county show. Our county show will follow the state guidelines for all three age group and Junior and Intermediate winners will advance to District. You will submit an 8x10 print of your entry on the county level. Advancing photos are submitted electronically. More details will come in later winter about a countywide workshop and the county deadline in February. Agricultural Product Identification contest provides youth the ability to further their knowledge and skills when evaluating ag products grown in Texas. Pre-registration is required via https://tinyurl.com/yxe9mlnn.

Then be sure and get registered on 4HOnline between October 1 – 28, 2020 for the Virtual Ag Product Identification Contest. This contest will be held on Tuesday, November 10th. Two contest times are available, 4:00 or 6:00 pm. Divisions will include Junior (3rd-8th), Senior (9th-12th) and an Adult Challenge!!! Team information is not required at time of registration but will be needed by November 6th. Adults will only judge as individuals.

A few reminders for food show and food challenge:

- For county and district, food show entries are prepared in advance and brought to the competition.
- All members of food challenge teams must submit separate entry forms.
- All entry forms require a parent signature.

- Use the scorecards from the state manuals to help prepare.
- Both contests are about having fun while you learn --do not be stressed about the county contest! It will be a relaxed and fun environment.

COVID-19 UPDATE

Our room capacity for meetings and activities has now been increased to 75% from 50%. We are still limited to under 50 people at any 4-H function unless we file a plan for more than 50 people more than 14 days in advance. It is a check sheet style form that we must complete in the office. If you are planning a 4-H meeting or event that will have more than 50 people or occupy more than 75% of the space, please get in contact with Natalie or Shannon three to four weeks in advance so that the plan can be submitted to our District Administrator.

Just a reminder that we have to have a COVID screening letter for every person at every 4-H activity (even project groups like food challenge practice). It is in the best interest of the kids participating and a requirement that we have to follow as indicated by our state program. Thanks for your patience and cooperation as we continue to follow our guidelines. COVID Screening Letter
