Major Show Lamb and Goat Validation



The exhibitor and a parent must be present. If you have an unavoidable conflict please contact the Extension Office prior to October 12. Heifer registration papers must be submitted to the Extension office via email as a color pdf file.

categories. The county deadline will be in February and more details will be released at a later date. On the county level we will have four age divisions, clover kids (k-2), junior (3-5), intermediate (6-8), and senior (9-12). Clover kids will be strictly an exhibition and will not compete. First place junior and intermediates will advance to the District 11 photography contest and first place seniors will advance to State.
