Record Book Corner: Section I - For those adults who did record books as kids, Section I is the Size and Scope and the Learning Experiences. Just as the form says, What did you do? What did you Learn? Each of your projects should have goals that you are working to achieve. If you have not set goals, identify them now. Aim for six goals. For example, "I want to learn the nutritional value of different types of feed" or "My goals is to help prepare family meals at least twice a week". These are just examples. Write your goals down and then start making plans to achieve them. Document the time spent, money spent, places you went, and what you did to learn about your project and achieve your goals.

MAJOR SHOW ENTRIES

All entries and fees for San Antonio, Houston, and Austin Livestock Shows are due in the County Extension Office by November 22.

QUALITY COUNTS REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL MAJOR SHOW PARTICIPANTS

All major show participants must complete an online Quality Counts training once as a junior (grade 3-5), once as an intermediate (grade 6-8), and once as a senior (grade 9-12). This process must be completed prior to submitting major show entries to the Extension Office. Quality Counts numbers are required on the major show entries.
