As we prepare for the upcoming San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo, we are looking for enthusiastic, responsible students in grades 9 -12 (Special exceptions can be made for deserving 8th grade students) to take part in this unique leadership opportunity. Your students will grow by being tour guides to younger children and by educating them on agriculture and its' importance to our daily lives.

- Tour dates are assigned on a first come, first serve basis
- Students must commit to volunteer from 7:45 am to 2:30 pm on their tour day
- Do not schedule students on the day they sift, classify, or show an animal
- Additional correspondence will be e-mailed after we receive your initial commitment

Lavaca County has to commit to the number of guides we will have before our actual tour date
is assigned. We will submit the date request in the order of the most preferred based on
responses given to our office.

Record Book Corner: Section III – Community Service – "I pledge my hands to larger service" –how are you serving others? If you are a junior or an intermediate, you get 15 entries in this section. Seniors have 25. Only those things that you do as a part of 4–H community service belongs here. Involvement in scouts, FFA, other school, youth organizations, and church belong in section VI. If you are in third through fifth grade you can include this year and two previous years. Sixth grade and up may include this year and three previous years. Always list the current year first and go backward. Your current year (unless you have extenuating circumstances like COVID) should have more than the previous as you are trying to show how you have grown and increased involvement.

Pro Tip: Make a note of how many people you are helping and how. For example, if you were one of the members who helped make goody bags for Festival of Lights your entry might look like this:

Year Role Activity
2021-22 M Worked as a team member to
Make Goody Bags for Santa
Claus at Hallettsville Festival
Of Lights.

Importance or Impact Spent 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours making 600 bags from donations provided by the community to the city of Hallettsville.

What does Role mean?

Y -you did it on your own. For example cleaning out your closet and donating your clothing.

M-You were part of a group. All of the clubs complete community service, some at every meeting. Remember all of those things that you do. Have you brought a donation to a meeting, helped decorate a sign or made cards, etc.???

P - As you get older in 4-H you want to look for opportunities to take Primary Leadership in Community Service. What ideas have you come up with and gotten others to do with you?

LIVESTOCK SHOW RULES

It is the responsibility of each 4-Her to read, understand, and follow the rules of each activity they participate in. This especially holds true for local and major livestock shows as consequences for breaking the rules can be quite significant. Please contact the Extension Office if questions should arise.

Medications: 4-H Livestock exhibitors should be aware of the withdrawal times on medications and medicated feeds being given to show animals. Technically withdrawal time should be calculated from the time the animal arrives at the show. Please contact your veterinarian or feed dealer if there are any questions. Animals with illegal chemicals found in their system will be disqualified.

Scales: Lavaca County 4-H has two scales for weighing swine, lambs, and goats that can be checked out. Please call the Extension Office to books a scale. Please remember when you transport the scale, it must be locked down. This keeps the cables from breaking. Also make sure you clean the scale before returning it to the 4-H building. PLEASE NOTE: DO NOT BRING ANIMALS INTO THE 4-H BUILDING.

Clippers: Lavaca County 4-H has animal clippers that can be checked out. Please call the Extension Office to book them. Clippers are checked out without blades. It is each families responsibility to have blades for their project. Below is a list of suggested blades to purchase for use on the 4-H clippers:
