#### Reimbursement for Select Activities

The 4-H County Council met on January 10, 2022 and approved the budget for the 2022 calendar year. The budget can be viewed on the next page. The finance committee had been working on a reimbursement policy so that financial support can be provided for certain 4-H activities that promote leadership and citizenship.
