## World Food Prize 2022 Texas Youth Conference



Abigail Cook Hill was named a Borlaug Scholar at the World Food Prize 2022 Texas Youth Institute Conference at Texas A&M University on March 11, 2022. The World Food Prize Foundation's mission is to elevate innovations and inspire action to sustainably increase the quality, quantity, and availability of food for all.

Participating 4-H members from across Texas were asked to select a country other than their own, and write a paper that detailed a solution on how to end hunger and poverty and improve food security in their selected country. The papers were submitted online

on February 14, 2022, and the students presented their idea to The World Food Prize Board of Reviewers on March 11, 2022, at Texas A&M University.

### Major Show Steer Tags & Validation

4-Hers who are planning to exhibit a steer at any of the major stock shows must order tags for their projects by Thursday, April 14. Tags are \$21 each and must be paid for when ordering. Orders can be placed at the County Extension Office using the attached order form.

#### Major Show Heifer Validation

If you plan to exhibit a heifer at any of the major livestock shows and she has not yet been validated, please contact the Extension Office by April 14 so we can order the correct amount of validation supplies. Heifer validation fee will be \$16 and will be collected at validation in June. Please note that heifers are only required to be validated for the major shows once. If you have previously validated a heifer and plan to show her again, she does not have to be revalidated. An additional validation for major show heifers will be held in October for heifers that have not been purchased prior to the June validation. However, this June validation is required for shows held this fall (for example State Fair of Texas). Also, please check to make sure the tattoos and brands on the registration papers match what is on the heifer prior to validation. If you have questions please contact Mr. DeForest.
