Bring your forms, notepads, or even your laptops and spend time here at the office working on your record book. No need to sign up –this is a come and go event. Natalie will be on hand to assist you and answer questions you might have.

Recordbooks are due by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, June 13. Awards Interviews are set for June 20. Candidates should tentatively hold 10:00 to 2:00 that day. Those who have conflicts will need to schedule a video interview with Natalie in advance.

Adult volunteers are needed to judge recordbooks that we will have received from other counties. Judging county level recordbooks is an excellent way to learn about the recordbook process. 


