This auction, as in the past, will take place at the Hallettsville Livestock Commission Company on Tuesday, June 13th. This is an opportunity for 4-Hers to join with area ranchers and agribusinesses to support the hospital. The role of Lavaca County 4-Hers will be to donate items to be sold at the auction and/or help on the day of the sale.

In the past, items have included baked goods, arts and crafts, plants, animal feed, various livestock health products, etc. Items may be delivered directly to the auction barn between 10:00 a.m. and 11:15 a.m. Please do not bring perishable items to the office ahead of time. Other items may be dropped off, but please know that the more that is left at the office ahead of time, the more help we will need to move it that day. Once you know what you are going to be donating, please call the office and let us know so we can ensure that we have plenty of items. The auction will take place after the sale of the cows at approximately 12:00 noon. We need everyone's participation to ensure that the auction is a success.

Safe Sitter®

The course provides hands-on practice in lifesaving techniques to young teens who are home alone, watching younger siblings, or babysitting so they are equipped with the skills and confidence to act in an emergency. They learn basic first aid and infant and child choking rescue. This class is open to youth in grades 6-11. It is ideal for those in junior high. Lavaca County EMS will provide infant and child CPR training. Students also receive instruction on how a child's age affects how to care for them, how to prevent problem behavior, and how to run their own babysitting business.

Students who graduate from a Safe Sitter® course receive a completion card demonstrating they know how to use their skills in the situations that they encounter.
