

Food Show is an individual event and open on the county level to all clover kids and members. We will follow the district guidelines on the county level. The theme is "Cooking Through the Decades". Junior teams will not use electricity -the supply box needs are reduced for this reason.

This event is open to 3rd – 8th Grade 4-H Members. **The Lavaca** County Council will reimburse you half of your registration fee if your paperwork is submitted in accordance with the reimbursement policy linked at the end of the newsletter.

<u>Adult Chaperones are required</u>. The required ratio is 1 adult for every 8 youth. Each youth should have a chaperone of the same gender assigned to him/her. As in the past, male chaperones are needed, or the Center will have to limit the number of male campers. So, keep this in mind if your county is bringing youth you will need to also have a male Chaperone with the group. Chaperones must be officially screened volunteers in 4HOnline. Make sure to get your chaperones registered sooner rather than later. Cost for the Chaperones is \$0.00. Natalie will be at District 11 Crossroads—so members will need to have an adult chaperone.

Record Book Corner

What exactly is a record book? Some of our local shows require "record books" but the forms that are required for your stock shows are not your 4-H Record book. The 4-H Record book has three parts – an information page, a story with photo portfolio, and the report forms. Our 4-H record books document everything we do in 4-H. Over the next several newsletters this "Record Book Corner" will be used to provide basic training on how to put together a 4-H record book. Throughout the year you should be writing down what you have done, what you have learned, where you have been, and who you have helped as a 4-H member. Take a lot of pictures of everything you doing. The best pictures show you learning and are active shots –not posing pictures. Then in June turn in a 4-H Record Book!

NATURAL RESOURCES PHOTOGRAPHY CONTEST

We are excited to announce the continuation of the state-level Natural Resource Photography Contest. It is open to junior, intermediate, and senior members, and categories are focused solely on the Natural Resource project areas. Here are a few key points:

- Open contest (no qualifying required) to all counties
- Open to juniors, intermediate, and senior age divisions
- 10 Natural Resource themed categories
- Same scoring matrix and general rules as the state contest
- Entry timeline is December 1-15
- No late entries accepted

<u>The Lavaca County 4-H Photography Contest</u> will be digital this year. In the past our participants have submitted 8 x 10 photos –we are no longer going to use printed pictures. More details on the county contest will be posted before Christmas. The County Contest will use the State Photography Contest categories and rules. Jrs and Intermediates who place first at county advance to District. First place senior entries advance directly to state.

STATE PHOTOGRAPHY CONTEST

The rules for the 2023-2024 state contest are also attached. For those who may be new to Extension, the state 4-H photography contest is a senior-only qualifying contest where photos qualify directly from COUNTY to STATE. Each county may submit no more than 1 photo per category (15 total). As stated in the rules, counties are highly encouraged to have some type of selection process in place to determine which photos are eligible. The timeline for entry is April 1-15. If you have questions about this contest, please contact Derrick Bruton. Key points:

- Qualify from county level (district contests have no bearing on qualifications)
- Open to senior age division only
- 15 categories (includes a new "Abandoned" theme for this year)
- Entry timeline is April 1-15
- No late entries accepted
