How do I decide which photos to put in my recordbook?

The photos that you include in your recordbook should help tell your story and demonstrate what you are learning or doing. For this reason, you want to select mostly pictures that are action shots of the work you put in. You should have more photos of the main project that you have entered as your category than of your other pictures. Avoid posing pictures. For example if you entered the Swine category, you might have pictures of you helping build a pen, feeding, and weighing. If you have photography as one of your projects, you may want to include one of your photos from this year. Unless it is a photography project photo, you should be in the picture.



How and where do I put them? There is not right and wrong placement of your pictures as long as you follow the page requirements in the Family Guide. Some people choose to embed their pictures throughout the story while others will put all pictures at the end on three pages. Either way, your pictures should make sense to where you have placed them and should show growth and learning.

Can I have pictures from previous years? Yes, but be careful to have more pictures from this year than previous ones. You don't want your story to look like you did not update it from the previous year.

Do I have to use captions? Captions are optional. Be consistent if you use captions put a caption in the same style on all pictures. Natalie prefers captions that have action verbs that explain what you are doing or learning. Try to be concise. Phrases instead of sentences are okay if you keep this style throughout.

Attention All Livestock Exhibitors

Please make sure you check the rules and schedule for the show in which you are participating.

It is the responsibility of each 4-Her to read, understand, and follow the rules of each activity they participate in. This especially holds true for local and major livestock shows, as consequences for breaking the rules can be quite significant. Please contact the Extension Office if questions should arise.

Medications:

4-H livestock exhibitors should be aware of the withdrawal times on medications and medicated feeds being given to show animals. Technically withdrawal time should be calculated from the time the animal arrives at the show. Please contact your veterinarian or feed dealer if there are any questions. Animals with illegal chemicals found in their system will be disqualified. Scales:

Lavaca County 4-H has two scales for weighing swine, lambs and goats that can be checked out. Please call the Extension Office to book a scale. Please remember when you transport the scale, it must be locked down. This keeps the cables from breaking. Also make sure you clean the scale before returning it to the 4-H building. **PLEASE NOTE: DO NOT BRING ANIMALS INTO THE 4-H BUILDING.** *Clippers:*

Lavaca County 4-H has animal clippers that can be checked out. Please call the Extension Office to book them. **Clippers are checked out without blades. It is each families responsibility to have blades for their projects.** Below is a list of suggested blades to purchase for use on the 4-H clippers

NATURAL RESOURCES PHOTOGRAPHY CONTEST—Entries due by 11:59 p.m. tonight!!

We are excited to announce the continuation of the state-level Natural Resource Photography Contest. It is open to junior, intermediate, and senior members, and categories are focused solely on the Natural Resource project areas. Here are a few key points:

- Open contest (no qualifying required) to all counties
- Open to juniors, intermediate, and senior age divisions
- 10 Natural Resource themed categories
- Same scoring matrix and general rules as the state contest
- Entry timeline is December 1-15
- No late entries accepted

The Lavaca County 4-H Photography Contest will be digital this year. In the past our participants have submitted 8 x 10 photos —we are no longer going to judge printed pictures. Jrs and Intermediates who place first at county advance to District. First place senior entries advance directly to state.

STATE PHOTOGRAPHY CONTEST

The rules for the 2023-2024 state contest are also attached. For those who may be new to Extension, the state 4-H photography contest is a senior-only qualifying contest where photos qualify directly from COUNTY to STATE. Each county may submit no more than 1 photo per category (15 total). As stated in the rules, counties are highly encouraged to have some type of selection process in place to determine which photos are eligible. The timeline for entry is April 1-15. If you have questions about this contest, please contact Derrick Bruton. Key points:

- Qualify from county level (district contests have no bearing on qualifications)
- Open to senior age division only
- 15 categories (includes a new "Abandoned" theme for this year)
- Entry timeline is April 1-15
- No late entries accepted

State Dog Show Validation

Texas 4-H Dog Show will be held on July 11-13, 2024 at the Walker County Fairgrounds in Huntsville, Texas. To be eligible for this show, dogs must be validated by January 10, 2024 in 4-H Online. We strongly encourage members who are considering participating in the dog show to validate their dogs even if they are not sure they will be participating in the Texas 4-H Dog Show. Completing the FREE validation process before January 10th will give them until entries are due in May to make a final decision.

There will be a couple of opportunities to practice with your dog whether you validated or not.

- Montgomery County 4-H Dog Show will be February 3, 2024 at the Montgomery County Fairgrounds in Conroe, Texas
- Brazos County 4-H Dog Show will be February 17, 2024
- Tarrant County 4-H Dog Show has been in April
- Wise County is has historically been done in June.

The state office will send details of each of these as soon as they have them available. Let the county office know if you are interested in receiving this information when it is released.
