If you are interested in participating in any of the following activities, please call the office at 361-798-2221 to be added to the list. A county wide workshop focused on the contests will be planned in conjunction with a fashion and interior project workshop once interest has been expressed. The date and time for the workshop(s) and contests will be set based on the availability of those who have expressed interest. In order to participate in the District contest in April you must qualify on the county level. Expressing interest is the first step in getting to participate but does not commit you to participation at District.

Spring Spectacular Contests:

- Fashion Show (Individual)-Construction and Buying Categories
- Consumer Decision Making (Individual and Team)
- Quiz Bowls: Horse, FCH, and Livestock (Individuals and Team)
- Duds to Dazzle (Team) team constructs a craft or wearable item in 50 minute prep
- Talent Showcase (Individuals and Groups)- cateogries:musical/instrumental, vocal, solo/band, choreographed routine, variety show, poetry/prose, and 4-H skit
- Fashion Storyboard (Individual) do not have to attend to participate digital submission
- Educational Presentations (Individuals and Teams) this is a speech with visuals/props – up to 12 minutes - categories: Promote 4-H, Ag and Natural Resources, Beef, Family Consumer Education, Health and Wellness, Horse, Open, Safety/Injury, STEM, Sheep and Goat, and Swine
- Public Speaking (Individual) this is a five to eight minute persuasive speech on the topic of your choice --- no visuals or props

In previous newsletters, we have talked about the story and photo portfolio and how you choose your category. If you haven't read those newsletters, visit the last several issues housed on the county website at https://lavaca.agrilife.org/4-hyters/ house hou

Section I continued from the last newsletter – it is important in this section that you name your projects correctly. Livestock Judging is the only judging activity that is also considered a project. Dairy, Horse, and other Judging contests and the Quiz bowls are all activities as part of the bigger project so for example, rather than listing Dairy Judging as the name of the project, you should be listing Dairy Cattle and then indicating what you learned about Dairy Cattle when you were participating in Dairy Judging. The same is true for Food Show or Food Challenge –they are activities as part of the bigger Food And Nutrition Project.

Do not be afraid to use tables and charts. If you do, try to be consistent from one project to the next in the way you present your information. Carry the same format over to Section IV where you report other projects.

Photography Project Information



The Lavaca County 4-H Photography Contest will be digital this year. In the past our participants have submitted 8 x 10 photos –we are no longer going to judge printed pictures. photography-contest-entries-due-by-february-1-at-500-p-m/ The County Contest will use the State Photography Contest categories and rules. Jrs and Intermediates who place first at county advance to District. First place senior entries advance directly to state. Please note that there was a revision to the submission instructions, rather than email, pictures will be submitted through Google Drive. The most current version of the rules have been updated on the website and are dated January 4, 2024.

Photography Contest Judges Needed – If you are a photographer that would like to judge photography entries, we will be seeking judges for our county contest, the district and state contests, and possibly other county contests. Aperture Academy at the Texas 4-H Center: It is a beginner's photography camp for youth entering grades 6-8 and is scheduled for July 7-10. It will be instructed by a team of outstanding photography volunteers and ambassadors. All cameras, equipment, and supplies for the camp will be provided. No prior knowledge or experience of photography is required. Registration is already open on the Texas 4-H Conference Center's <u>website</u>. Space is limited to 25 campers, so sign up soon!!

JUNIOR MASTER PHOTOGRAPHERS / PHOTOGRAPHY AMBASSADORS

There are two JMP workshops each fall that are open to intermediate and senior age divisions. Youth who attend both workshops, pass a test, and complete a few prescribed activities can attain JMP certification. Once a certified JMP reaches 9th grade or higher, they can then apply to become an ambassador (with no additional training required). In a nutshell, the JMP program is the training ground and pathway to become a photography ambassador. More details about the JMP workshops will come out in the summer, but if you are interested Natalie can forward you two brochures that have a little more detail about those two leadership programs.

PHOTOGRAPHY JUDGING CONTEST

This is an invitational contest for senior 4-H members and is held at Roundup in June. The contest format is equivalent to other judging contests like CDM, horse, or livestock. Rules, resources, and practice classes can be found on our website <u>here</u>.

TEXAS 4-H CONGRESS PRESS CORPS

At this event, we have a team of youth who serve as the press corps. This event takes place in July and the press corps oversees documenting the event through photographs, video newscasts, and written news articles. If you know of senior 4-H members with these talents, please encourage them to apply when press corps registration opens (scheduled to be posted in February). Watch for an email from Megan Logan in the coming weeks.

Summer Camp Registration is now open at the Texas 4-H Conference Center. The Conference Center, located in the heart of Texas at Lake Brownwood, was established to be a central meeting place for statewide 4-H opportunities. The Lavaca County 4-H Reimbursement policy includes the opportunity for reimbursement of half of your registration fee for any camp you attend at the 4-H Center.
