If you are interested in participating in any of the following activities, please call the office at 361-798-2221 to be added to the list. A county wide workshop focused on the contests will be planned in conjunction with a fashion and interior project workshop once interest has been expressed. The date and time for the workshop(s) and contests will be set based on the availability of those who have expressed interest. In order to participate in the District contest in April you must qualify on the county level. Expressing interest is the first step in getting to participate but does not commit you to participation at District.

Spring Spectacular Contests:

- Fashion Show (Individual)-Construction and Buying Categories
- Consumer Decision Making (Individual and Team)
- Quiz Bowls: Horse, FCH, and Livestock (Individuals and Team)
- Duds to Dazzle (Team) team constructs a craft or wearable item in 50 minute prep
- Talent Showcase (Individuals and Groups)- cateogries:musical/instrumental, vocal, solo/band, choreographed routine, variety show, poetry/prose, and 4-H skit
- Fashion Storyboard (Individual) do not have to attend to participate digital submission
- Educational Presentations (Individuals and Teams) this is a speech with visuals/props – up to 12 minutes - categories: Promote 4-H, Ag and Natural Resources, Beef, Family Consumer Education, Health and Wellness, Horse, Open, Safety/Injury, STEM, Sheep and Goat, and Swine
- Public Speaking (Individual) this is a five to eight minute persuasive speech on the topic of your choice --- no visuals or props

Record Book Corner

Where do I get the forms? Go to https://texas4-h.tamu.edu/recordbooks/

In previous newsletters, we have talked about the story and photo portfolio and how you choose your category. If you haven't read those newsletters, visit the last several issues housed on the county website at https://lavaca.agrilife.org/4-h/newsletters/

Section I of the record forms is 4-H Project Experiences. You can have up to four projects in this section. List the project that is the category you are entering first. Use charts or graphs when possible to show how your project has grown or changed. Include quantifiable information—how much did you spend, how many hours did you spend, how many items did you make, etc? You will likely need to also include a small amount of narrative to be able to tell the things you have done and learned. Avoid lengthy paragraphs, instead use bullet points to keep the information concise. The record book judges have a lot to read, avoid repetition and avoid being too wordy.

Examples of things you have done include attending workshops and clinics, participating in contests, reading books or watching television shows about the project, etc. Do NOT include in this section your contest results —they go in a separate section.

Attention All Livestock Exhibitors

Please make sure you check the rules and schedule for the show in which you are participating.

It is the responsibility of each 4-Her to read, understand, and follow the rules of each activity they participate in. This especially holds true for local and major livestock shows, as consequences for breaking the rules can be quite significant. Please contact the Extension Office if questions should arise.

Medications:

4-H livestock exhibitors should be aware of the withdrawal times on medications and medicated feeds being given to show animals. Technically withdrawal time should be calculated from the time the animal arrives at the show. Please contact your veterinarian or feed dealer if there are any questions. Animals with illegal chemicals found in their system will be disqualified. Scales:

Lavaca County 4-H has two scales for weighing swine, lambs and goats that can be checked out. Please call the Extension Office to book a scale. Please remember when you transport the scale, it must be locked down. This keeps the cables from breaking. Also make sure you clean the scale before returning it to the 4-H building. **PLEASE NOTE: DO NOT BRING ANIMALS INTO THE 4-H BUILDING.** *Clippers:*

Lavaca County 4-H has animal clippers that can be checked out. Please call the Extension Office to book them. **Clippers are checked out without blades. It is each families responsibility to have blades for their projects.** Below is a list of suggested blades to purchase for use on the 4-H clippers

Steers (slick shear): Oster 83-84 Goats:Lister Cover Cote blades Lambs: Lister 2241 Fine

Swine: Andis #10 blade to be used with guards

<u>The Lavaca County 4-H Photography Contest</u> will be digital this year. In the past our participants have submitted 8 x 10 photos —we are no longer going to judge printed pictures. Jrs and Intermediates who place first at county advance to District. First place senior entries advance directly to state. Please note that there was a revision to the submission instructions, rather than email, pictures will be submitted through Google Drive. The most current version of the rules have been updated on the website and are dated January 4, 2024.

Photography Contest Judges Needed – If you are a photographer that would like to judge photography entries, we will be seeking judges for our county contest, the district and state contests, and possibly other county contests. State Dog Show Validation

Texas 4-H Dog Show will be held on July 11-13, 2024 at the Walker County Fairgrounds in Huntsville, Texas. To be eligible for this show, dogs must be validated by January 10, 2024 in 4-H Online. We strongly encourage members who are considering participating in the dog show to validate their dogs even if they are not sure they will be participating in the Texas 4-H Dog Show. Completing the FREE validation process before January 10th will give them until entries are due in May to make a final decision.

There will be a couple of opportunities to practice with your dog whether you validated or not.

- Montgomery County 4-H Dog Show will be February 3, 2024 at the Montgomery County Fairgrounds in Conroe, Texas
- Brazos County 4-H Dog Show will be February 17, 2024
- Tarrant County 4-H Dog Show has been in April
- Wise County is has historically been done in June.

The state office will send details of each of these as soon as they have them available. Let the county office know if you are interested in receiving this information when it is released.
