Understanding what goes in Sections IV

Pay attention to the page requirements - Juniors only get one page - Intermediates and Seniors can have two pages. This is where you list the projects that you did not put in Section I. You can have up to four projects in section I. If you have multiple projects in section I and have nothing to put here, move one to this section, so you do not lose these points when your book is scored.

These are your smaller projects, not your main projects. If possible, keep your style the same as what you used in section I.
