Wildfire Relief

The county council voted to donate \$1000 to the Panhandle Wildfire Relief efforts. There is still a tremendous need for monetary donations to go towards both agriculture supplies (hay, cubes, fencing, etc.) and personal property recovery. Anyone wishing to add on to the donation may drop off checks, money orders, and Visa gift cards to the Extension Office by Noon this Monday, March 18.

Calendar Fundraiser

The county council voted in their March meeting to hold a calendar fundraiser ending May 31st. Once the calendar page is finalized it will be made available to all members in this newsletter and copies will also be available in the office. The calendar fundraiser will take place throughout the month of May and will have 31 days. The goal is to find a sponsor for each day on the calendar and have them donate the dollar amount that corresponds with the day of the month. May 1 is \$1, May 2nd is \$2 and so on. Sponsors may choose to buy multiple days. We hope that all members will participate in the fundraising effort. Funds raised will support our general county funds that include project supplies and activities, awards, scholarships, leadership activities, and community service. Horse Validation

Texas 4-H Horse Validation for the 2024 season will be open in 4-H Online from March 1 – May 1, 2024.



A few important reminders:

- ALL horses must be validated/re-validated each year. There is no limit to the number of horses that can be validated. You are encouraged to validate all horses that may possibly be shown at district and/or state shows. Only state validated horses can be substituted in the event that a validated horse becomes unusable due to lameness, sickness, etc.
- The family can submit payment of \$10.00 per horse (\$20.00 after April 15th, or \$250 from May 1st to May 5th), in the form of a **credit card ONLY.**
 - From March 1 April 15, the validation cost for each horse is \$10.00. The \$10.00 cost is only guaranteed if the animal validation is approved by the county office by the April 15th deadline and the payment is processed.
 - From April 16 May 1, the validation cost for each horse is \$20.00. The \$20.00 cost is only guaranteed if the animal validation is approved by the county office by the May 1st deadline and the payment is processed.
- Each validation must include front view, right side view, and left side view images. The entire horse should be included in the photo and markings should be clearly visible.
- If the horse is registered, a copy of the registration papers must be uploaded. These papers must list the 4-Her, sibling, parent, stepparent, grandparent or legal guardian as the current owner. If the ownership is in the process of being transferred, please list "pending" in the registration number area. Once the updated registration papers have been received, please email me a copy of the new papers and I will add it to the validation online.
- Lease horses are eligible to be validated and shown at District and State 4-H Horse Shows. An official Texas 4-H Horse Lease Agreement must be signed by the exhibitor, horse owner, and the supervising County Extension Agent. The lease period must include, at minimum, May 1st to August 31st of the current 4-H year. The lease agreement form can be found at https://texasyouthlivestock.com/horse-validation/ and must be uploaded in 4-H Online at the time of validation.
- Image uploads in 4-H Online must be in the form of a .jpg, .gif or .png file.
- **Families should validate each horse only one time.** Once the horse is validated, any sibling within that family in 4-H Online is eligible to show the horse at their district show and/or the State 4-H Horse Show.
- Youth validating a futurity horse must be at least 12 years of age (as of Sept. 1, 2023) and at least in the 6th grade.

- The family will receive an automated message from 4-H Online when the County Extension Agent has approved the horse at the county level. **This approval does NOT guarantee eligibility**. After it is approved at the county level, the validation will then be reviewed at the state level. <u>The family will be notified by June 1st if there are any issues with</u> the validation at the state level.
 - We will begin to review validations at the state level on March 1st and will be working closely with families and agents to fix errors as quickly as possible prior to the validation deadline.

Major Show Steer and Heifer Tag Orders


Major show steer and heifer tag orders will be due in the Extension Office by March 28.

Remember that all state validated heifers will be tagged similar to steers. Please order tags accordingly. Those planning to show a steer or heifer at any major livestock show must order and pay for a tag by the deadline. Please order accurately. No refunds will be given for unused tags. As in the past, there will be a second heifer validation in October. The order form attached in this newsletter.

State Fair Lamb, Goat and Swine Tag Orders

State Fair Lamb and Goat tags are due in the Extension Office by March 28. Order form is attached in this newsletter.

NOTE: Projects validated in June for the Fall 2024 season are validated for the Spring 2025 season as well. Breeding Sheep and Breeding Goats roll over validation for three years, they do not need to be validated every year. The order form is attached in this newsletter.
