#### Calendar Fundraiser

Section VII - College and Career Exploration

Here is where you list everything you have done to help you prepare for a career. You may include non-4-H activities. Include presentations you attended that were given by professionals, anyone you have interviewed about jobs, tours you have taken, job shadowing, mentoring, research, work experience, dual credit, test taking, etc ---

It is okay if you do not know what career you want to list but try to put an industry like agriculture, medical field, education, etc. if you are unsure. The learning experiences that you have had this year should at least in part match the career you list.

This is the final installment in this year's Record Book Corner. Record Books will be due on Tuesday, June 11 no later than 5:00 p.m. There will be no exceptions to the deadline as they will be loaded at that point to be judged.

All awards applications and scholarships are due on June 11 as well. Interviews will be held on Wednesday, June 19.

If you would be interested in attending an in person or online record book workshop please call the Extension Office at 361-798-2221 and request the training and provide your preference of in person or online. The last two trainings that were offered were not attended so one will not be planned and unless requested by three or more people.

Natalie is available by appointment or chance anytime to help with record books. It is one of her most favorite parts of 4-H and is eager to help you.

#### **Horse Validation**

Texas 4-H Horse Validation for the 2024 season will be open in 4-H Online from March 1 – May 1, 2024.



#### A few important reminders:

- ALL horses must be validated/re-validated each year. There is no limit to the number of horses
  that can be validated. You are encouraged to validate all horses that may possibly be shown at district and/or
  state shows. Only state validated horses can be substituted in the event that a validated horse becomes
  unusable due to lameness, sickness, etc.
- The family can submit payment of \$10.00 per horse (\$20.00 after April 15<sup>th</sup>, or \$250 from May 1<sup>st</sup> to May 5<sup>th</sup>), in the form of a **credit card ONLY**.
  - From March 1 April 15, the validation cost for each horse is \$10.00. The \$10.00 cost is only guaranteed if the animal validation is approved by the county office by the April 15<sup>th</sup> deadline and the payment is processed.
  - From April 16 May 1, the validation cost for each horse is \$20.00. The \$20.00 cost is only guaranteed if the animal validation is approved by the county office by the May 1<sup>st</sup> deadline and the payment is processed.
- Each validation must include front view, right side view, and left side view images. The entire horse should be included in the photo and markings should be clearly visible.
- If the horse is registered, a copy of the registration papers must be uploaded. These papers must list the 4-Her, sibling, parent, stepparent, grandparent or legal guardian as the current owner. If the ownership is in the process of being transferred, please list "pending" in the registration number area. Once the updated registration papers have been received, please email me a copy of the new papers and I will add it to the validation online.
- Lease horses are eligible to be validated and shown at District and State 4-H Horse Shows. An official Texas 4-H Horse Lease Agreement must be signed by the exhibitor, horse owner, and the supervising County Extension Agent. The lease period must include, at minimum, May 1<sup>st</sup> to August 31<sup>st</sup> of the current 4-H year. The lease agreement form can be found at <a href="https://texasyouthlivestock.com/horse-validation/">https://texasyouthlivestock.com/horse-validation/</a> and must be uploaded in 4-H Online at the time of validation.
- Image uploads in 4-H Online must be in the form of a .jpg, .gif or .png file.
- **Families should validate each horse only one time.** Once the horse is validated, any sibling within that family in 4-H Online is eligible to show the horse at their district show and/or the State 4-H Horse Show.
- Youth validating a futurity horse must be at least 12 years of age (as of Sept. 1, 2023) and at least in the 6<sup>th</sup> grade.

- The family will receive an automated message from 4-H Online when the County Extension Agent has approved the horse at the county level. **This approval does NOT guarantee eligibility**. After it is approved at the county level, the validation will then be reviewed at the state level. The family will be notified by June 1<sup>st</sup> if there are any issues with the validation at the state level.
  - We will begin to review validations at the state level on March 1<sup>st</sup> and will be working closely with families and agents to fix errors as quickly as possible prior to the validation deadline.


#### **Major Show Steer and Heifer Tag Orders**


Major show steer and heifer tag orders are Due Today!!

Remember that all state validated heifers will be tagged similar to steers. Please order tags accordingly. Those planning to show a steer or heifer at any major livestock show must order and pay for a tag by the deadline. Please order accurately. No refunds will be given for unused tags. As in the past, there will be a second heifer validation in October. The order form attached in this newsletter.
