Opportunities for our members increase significantly in junior high and high school. State 4-H Round-Up is the highlight of the Texas 4-H program each year and an opportunity for our teen leaders to come together to learn about leadership and career development and compete in dozens of contests. Some of the contests are qualifying events while others are invitational. If you are a senior level 4-H member Texas 4-H Round-Up participation should be one of your goals.

The following contests do not require individuals to qualify at district level contests however they must be a member by March 1, 2024 or have competed in another District level contest. Contests are open to all 4-H members who are in the 9th – 12th grades as of the September 1, 2023 school year. Invitational contests include:

NOTE: Those individuals qualifying to participate in the Qualifying Livestock Judging Contest and Qualifying Meat Judging Contest MAY NOT participate in the Invitational Livestock Judging Contest or Invitational Meat Judging Identification Contests, respectively. See specific contest rules Regarding eligibility requirements.

In addition, there will be leadership, project, and career focused workshops for adults and youth throughout the week and a community service project opportunity. Adults planning to chaperone youth must be enrolled in 4-H online as a parent volunteer no later than April 29th.
